The Local to Finnentrop

This amazing scenario is created in cooperation with BeeKay. Just before you start up the scenario, make sure the “Automatic Fireman” is disabled in the game setting in order to improve the game experience, firing and driving skills.

This scenario is based at the Ruhr-Sieg Line mainly between Hagen and Siegen just south of the Ruhr Area and not that far away from the famous DGEG museum near Bochum-Dalhausen.

The local to Finnentrop is actually based at the environment of the German Federal State Railway (DB) basics in the period of the steam era, The steam locomotive still in service but many were already put at Non-Active at that moment.

A class V200 is stuck with an engine failure at the platform at Siegen is already uncoupled and pulled away by a shunter engine class 323 to a siding. Your task now is to take over that train with steam locomotive class 03 (03 111) which already puts in front of the train by the shunting and workshop crew. The only thing you have to do is to clean and regain fire and pressure using the tools of the fireman.

The Ruhr-Sieg DLC as it comes is based at the original route between these German cities. The former workshops and steam locomotive sheds such as Hagen-Eckesey, Hagen-Vorhalle, Hagen-Hbf and Finnentrop Bw are unfortunately not included in the DLC.

With buildings-, loft, clutter and car assets included in the RRR packages the route is “refurnished” as far as possible with waterloaders, coal depots, oil depots and more at almost every station along the route. Modern cars and modern areas are covered and stored away underneath RRR buildings to intend to recreate the ambient of the steam era from the 70’s. The lack of semaphore signals is covered by the signal as they came with the original DLC. These type of German main signals and distance/approach signals are quite suitable and adaptable to the steam era in the 70’s as well.

Firing and driving a steam locomotive requires a skilled driver and the complete attention and vigilance during running. Driving the scenario in Expert Mode requires knowledge and wisdom about the technical aspects.

Scenario classification

To achieve the full advantage of the packages you need to know the classification and download and install the rolling stock and engines as mentioned on the last page of this folder The classification method is introduced by SteamtrainsUnlimited.

There are 6 different types of classifications:

1 Chrome: *Freeware*

This scenario class only contains all default rolling stock as they came with the original DLC. There are no other assets needed to driv a scenario in this range.

2 Bronze: *Freeware*

This scenario class contains the DLC original rolling stock and all freeware rolling stock according the steam era in Germany.

3 Silver: *Freeware*

This class is equal to the “Silver” class but in addition a small range of payware is included according the steam era.

4 Sapphire € 2,49


This class is equal to the “Silver” class but with a wide and complete range of additional payware rolling stock range according the steam era

5 Gold: € 2,99

This class is equal to “Silver” but rolling stock and of the Expert Line are required which has been distributed by Just Trains or Virtual Railroad.

6 Platinum: € 3,49

This class is equal to “Gold” class but additional you need more DLC routes in order to have the rolling stock and/or clutter/buildings which are used in this scenario according the steam era.

Needed Freeware :

All European freeware trains/rolling stock including the repaints concerning the steam era of Germany.

Quick Install method of more packages together:

Some knowledge of the RS/TS Package Manager is advisable.

- 1 Execute self installers as they come along with packages.
- 2 *Unpack Non executable self Installer packages by using WinZip or 7zip into your temporary map .*
- 3 *Create a 2nd temporary map (and name it: "su-scenario"for example)*
- 4 *Copy All unpacked RWP / RPK files into the 2nd temporary map by using the shortcuts: Ctrl-C and Ctrl-V if desired.*
- 5 *Then open the Package Manager from RS/TS and click Install. This will open up the Load-package-screen. Then find and select all the RWP/ RPK files which you just had copied into the 2nd temporary map by using Ctrl-A*
- 6 *In the Package Manager pop-up-screen click open and all the packages will install right away. After installing click the refresh button and check out the list of installed packages. If done you are ready to launch RS/TS*
- 7 *Now launch RS/T and select the desired scenario. All aboard and go!!!"*
